#### Option #1

- Mirror location of Science to STEM
- Davies would be relocated to the South
- Reconfigure parking lot to South, lose parking

spaces (93 spaces)

- Drop Off Loop
- Departments in Administration are relocated to the Student Services building, and opens up for potential green space and parking
- Need to define a new location for Staff Parking (if not in Drop Off Loop)
- Need to take into consideration a staging room for construction in this Option

Proposal to relocate Transit Center by Fine Arts

- Require coordination with City to facilitate this potential, create a street off of College Oak
- The benefit of the current location for the Transit Center is it being right on the street so buses can come in and out

Option #2

- Davies has a front on the Promenade, connected to south parking lot and wraps around Ranch House
- Science is on the West along Transit Center
- Drop Off Loop
- 40 parking spaces lost

Option #3

- Davies is on the West and wraps around Ranch House, and would be three stories
- Science is to the East of Davies
- Staging is a concern for this option

Option #4

- Davies Hall on West
- Science to North of Davies Hall/West of current Stem Building
- Miner's Oak goes away
- Open up future development site

-Potential for building Science to allow for future growth to be added on a later date

Constructability

- The 2012 Master Plan was to remove warehouse, build Davies Hall while current Davies remains constructed
- Need to consider the constructability of Davies Hall
- Option 2 may be preferred for staging
- Look for existing ways we can upgrade the parking

- lot without changing the entire flow of parking
  - Option 1 and 2 may not be feasible due to the constructability concerns as well as the timelines
  - Option 3 and 4 are more feasible
  - Can take 18 months to two years for the bond to go through
  - Need to do an evaluation of current bond processing
- Option 1 and 2
- Requires Davies to be completed before we can begin on Science
  - Portable Village could be use as staging

### One-Stop Center

#### 1st Option

- Student Services Building has been renamed to "Welcome and Support Center", which will be the name for the One-Stop Center
- Alternate Student Drop Off Loop
- Administration removed and moving into current Student Services Building
- 25,000 square foot building

#### 2nd Option

- Different configuration to building
- Maintaining Drop Off Loop
- Ties into Promenade
- Future Instructional Space
- Administration Removed
- Discussed the potential of increasing the size of Counseling if moved into One-Stop Center
- District has to evaluate the district needs to accommodate an increase in a division
- We may just need to be more effective in our spaces
- We should determine which services should move into this space
- If Counseling were to move, as well as Printing, we could reconstruct the administration building to be the most efficient for student services
- May create a jam of students having all services in one building
- Suggested to completely reconfigure Admin building once printing moves
- Moving Admin to North lot allows for greater access for students

Zone Review – DRAFT · Zone Boundaries – Wayfinding Project · Zone Descriptions</p>	<p>All</p>	<p>Proposal of Wayfinders -The Campus will be broken into four zones, coded by a color and an icon 1) Red, Apple 2) Blue, Wave 3) Yellow, Sun 4) Green, Tree -Having the zones coded by color will aid in providing clearer directions to a building, as well assist students with disabilities by having an icon to reference -The parking lots will be incorporated into the zones and named according to the street/landmark they are near. The Parking Lots names will include Myrtle, Myrtle West, Myrtle East, Orange Grove, College Oak and Stadium -The zones will be referred to as the color associated with it, such as the Blue Zone, Red Zone. It was decided to associate the color with the zone rather than the buildings since there is often change happening with divisions and departments, that it would not be constant over time to name it according to the building -There are a couple of main roads/trails that have been named - The road that wraps in front of PE/HEED to Tech Ed has been named "Beaver Lane". The trail that runs along Arcade Creek has been named "Arcade Creek Trail." The loop that runs behind PE and to CDC has been named the "Hutchison Loop"</p> <p>Feedback from the Project Team -Referring to the zone with the color, such as the Red Zone, may mean something differently to our veterans -Beaver Boulevard suggested rather than Beaver Lane -Ped Mall where Hutchison Loop/Beaver Plaza</p>
