- STAT 307 meets the CSU's Basic and Ethnicity in American Society graduation requirement.
- Both STAT 300 and MATH 340 are required by many institutions.
- See ASSIST/CSU for the transfer requirements of the institutions to which you plan to transfer.
- The UC system requires proficiency in a language other than English equivalent to two years of high school study. See a counselor about fulfilling this requirement.

EXPLANATION OF CATEGORIES

Req	Required Core	A course that is required for this degree.
GE	General Education	A course that fulfills a specific general education requirement for this degree, which can be replaced with another course that meets the same requirement.
RE	Restricted Elective	A course selected from a list of elective courses specified for this degree in the catalog, which can be replaced with another course from the same list.
Elect	Elective	A degree-applicable course that is part of a degree readiness to ensure that there is a total of at least 60 units, which is a requirement for an associate degree.
