AB 1855 Open meetings: teleconferences: community college student body associations and student-run organizations

11.1 F24-11 Association of California Community College Administration Conference

11.2 F24-12 SSCCC General Assembly

This time is reserved to take action on the passage of twelve thousand dollars (\$12,000.00) for members of ASB to attend the SSCCC General Assembly on April 4, 2025 - April 6, 2025, in Los Angeles, CA. During the General Assembly, delegates come together to provide the Board of Directors, through the resolution process, with priorities that guide the organization for the upcoming year. Delegates will also have the opportunity to elect the 2025 - 26 SSCCC Board Officers during the General Assembly and to network with other student leaders.

11.3 F24-13 National Student Advocacy Conference

This time is reserved to take action on the passage of nine thousand dollars (\$9,000.00) to attend the National Student Advocacy Conference March 15, 2025 to March 18, 2025 in Washington, DC. The conference focuses on issues critical to the success and persistence of community college students. Over the years ASACC has focused on issues including: Pell Grants, Reauthorization of the Higher Education Act, Employee Educational Assistance, simplifying the FAFSA, student loan interest rates, and using pre-tax dollars to repay student loans to name just a few.
