As a follow-up to the memo shared by Vice President of Instruction, Angela Milano, last semester regarding HomeBases relocation and sustainability efforts, we are beginning a series of brainstorming and listening sessions to explore potential possibilities for the colocation of the HomeBases.

Reviewing the resources we can allocate to HomeBases, we can sustain three locations or fewer across the campus. We have collected feedback from surveys and listening sessions, and used that to develop a <u>set of guiding principles</u> as we considered co-location options.

Option 1:

- Location: Arts and Science Building | HomeBases: Arts, People, Culture & Society, STEM
- Location: STEM Building (3rd Floor) | HomeBases: Business, Language & Communication
- Location: CTE Building | HomeBases: Health & Education, MCT, Public Service

Option 2:

- Location: Health & Education Building | HomeBases: Health & Education, Public Service
- STEM building (3rd floor) | HomeBases: Business, Language & Communication, STEM
- Location: CTE Building | HomeBases: Arts, MCT, People, Culture & Society

Option 3:

- Location: Arts & Science | HomeBases: Arts, STEM
- STEM building (3rd floor) | HomeBases: Business, Language & Communication. People, Culture & Society
- Location: CTE Building | HomeBases: Health & Education, Public Service, MCT

Option 4:

- Location: TBD | All HomeBases Co-located: Arts, STEM, Business, Language & Communication, People, Culture & Society, Health & Education, Public Service, MCT

Student Senate Bill S25 – 13 Governmental Stipends for the 2024-2025 Academic Year

Motion: That the Associated Student Body of American River College Student Senate (ASBARCSS) allocate up to \$20,000 to fund stipends for student government leaders for the 2024–2025 academic year.

This funding supports equitable compensation for student leaders who dedicate substantial time and effort to enhancing campus life, governance, and advocacy. Providing stipends helps reduce financial barriers and ensures that leadership opportunities remain accessible to all students, regardless of socioeconomic background.

According to the California Community Colleges Chancellor's Office regarding allowable uses of the Student Representation Fee (SRF), this funding falls under: "Stipends to participate in participatory governance meetings and activities." This allocation is therefore consistent with state policy and the intended use of SRF funds (see SRF Guidance Memo, p. 2 for screenshot).

The stipends will be distributed per semester as follows:

- 1. Student Senate Stipend Allocations (per semester):
 - a. President: \$600
 - b. Vice President: \$500
 - c. Directors / Whip Positions (x6): \$400
 - d. Legislative Analyst: \$375
 - e. Senators (x11): \$300

Total Estimated Cost Per Semester for Senate: \$600 + \$500 + \$2,400 + \$375 + \$3,300 = \$7,175

Total Estimated Annual Cost for Senate: \$14,350

- 2. Clubs and Events Board (CAEB) Stipend Allocations (per semester):
 - a. President: \$500
 - b. Vice President: \$400
 - c. Directors and Historian (x5): \$300

Total Estimated Cost Per Semester for CAEB: \$500 + \$400 + \$1,500 = \$2,400

Total Estimated Annual Cost for CAEB: \$4,800

Total Estimated Annual Cost for the 2024-2025 ASB Board: \$19,150

3. Total Allocation Request: To account for any potential adjustments or unforeseen expenses, the total requested amount is rounded up to \$20,000.

Excerpt from "Allowable Student Representation Fee Uses" Memo (ESS 22-300-006, May 3, 2022), p. 2:

SRF Allowable Uses

May 3, 2022

Vote:

- Student attendance at conferences, meetings, and events sponsored by the SSCCC or other nonpartisan student organizations that are for the purposes of legislative training, legislative awareness, disbursement of legislative information, or the election of SSCCC officers
- Visits to legislative offices to lobby and advocate for issues affecting the student body
- Hosting costs (food, marketing materials, spirit wear) for on- or off-campus meetings, conferences, and events to provide the student body legislative training, legislative awareness and information, and to increase engagement in student government and participatory governance
- Travel costs (flight, mileage, lodging, local transportation, meals, business center use, incidentals & per diem) associated with attending or hosting conferences, meetings, and events
- Stipends to participate in participatory governance meetings and activities
- Organizational dues and or special donations to the SSCCC or any other recognized student lobbying association
- Local or campus media campaigns to make available information about legislative issues of interest to the student body
- Purchase of equipment used for lobbying and or advocacy (e.g. computers, printers, Wi-Fi hot spots, tablets, etc.)
- Subscriptions to education oriented newsletters and or magazines
