Preliminaries

1. Call to Order

5. Public Comment Period (3 minutes per speaker)

- Amanda Lewis, Administrative Assistant from the President's Office. Reminding about the 70th anniversary Homecoming. Distributed flyers. Emphasized the importance of faculty involvement because faculty are the heart of all we do if students see faculty, they are more inclined to get involved. Amanda reminded everyone that Homecoming Week at ARC is coming up scheduled for October 25 through November 1, 2025. Amanda distributed flyers with all the events across campus during the last week of October (Oct 25-Nov 1). She is hopeful that everyone is able to come to one or some of the events. First 800 ARC-affiliated people (so bring your ARC ID with you) who come to the Sat (11/01) Homecoming Gameday (1pm) / Spirit Fest (10am-1pm) 70th Anniversary Edition will get free food and free shirts.. - A senator wanted to thank the Academic Senate Executive Team for <u>the letter of response</u> to the email announcing the HomeBase Co-Location.
- Michael Angelone, English invited all to leverage him as CCC AI-Change Maker so we can be proactive in the discussions and get help from the Academic Senate body to facilitate campus-wide conversations on how to use AI as an accessibility tool, or whether we are pro-adoption/anti-adoption, and so on. Michael Angelone wanted to emphasize he is not "the" AI-person.
- Another senator wanted to offer a suggestion to the SEP that was approved and explain why they
 abstained. When reviewing the SEP document, they noticed there was no preliminary budget present and
 would like to suggest an expenditure cycle from the previous cycle be included to help inform this new
 cycle.

- **8.** Faculty Hiring Prioritization Presentations started at 2:43pm.
 - The meeting was recorded so Senators could refer back to it and watch the <u>Faculty Position Request Presentations</u> later, if they so desired or needed to (running time: 3 hr 22 mins).
 - To check the order of presentations and to access available slides (when applicable), refer to the Faculty Prioritization Schedule.
 - After all presentations were completed, discussion about how many departments are overwhelmed by demand, resulting in overworked colleagues taking overload, sometimes over 1.4FTE, to serve students and maintain program integrity, while also meeting the rapid growth of dual enrollment at the expense of our community college students.
 - Questions raised as to why are departments required to teach dual enrollment? And why were we not given more positions to align with the significant impact of dual enrollment on our college?
 - To add to the complexity of the conversation, discussion about the impact of overextended faculty on quality of education, including in disciplines where class sizes are large with enrollment caps of 40-45 students. How can a faculty member have the time and the bandwidth to be timely and fully available for their students when they are spread so thin, meeting students where they are at?
 - Some senators suggested that departments should consider declining staffing dual enrollment courses since it is significantly impacting our college's ability to serve our adult learners/community college students. Because administrators have been telling dept chairs that this has to be done, and the question raised is: does it have to be this way?
 - Another point raised was about looking at data of hiring done 15-20 years ago and do a better job
 forecasting the college's needs as retirements are anticipated and those replacement positions are not
 filled. Senators discussed the challenges of attempting to predict the number of retirements based on
 prior hires since there are many factors involved such as a faculty leaving the faculty position sooner for
 another job opportunity, economic factors that may delay retirement, and so on.
