5. Public Comment Period (3 minutes per speaker)

Brett (Student Life Supervisor): Student elections reminder. Students encouraged to run for Senate, CAEB, and Board Trustee. April 1st is the deadline to apply. April 15th is the candidate forum. April 22-23 will be the election (on eServices). Urge to encourage students to apply (especially those with leadership interest and potential). All welcome to apply. 9 Senate executive positions in Senate, 8 CAEB, 15 student senators. Also plugged the ARC Rugby team (ranked #3 in the nation as D1-AA).

Vivian (Work Experience): Urge to engage with Handshake (accessible via the single-sign on landing page with two figures shaking hands) and to encourage your students to engage. Sacramento Kings will be coming to present virtually. The Department of Water Resources also will present soon.

Ricardo (History): Hotep Consulting discussed. Asked if we saw the result of the last time that Hotep Consulting came to campus. Expressed the view that this feels like a waste of resources.

6. President's Report

Executive Leadership Team (ELT): Councils are looking to recharter. Also, the Institutional Equity Plan expires at the end of this year, but the ELT has suggested to approve a one-year extension of that deadline to allow for a formal and thorough review of that document.

Students on hiring committees and "Hiring the Best": Students who are appointed to committees will go through a formal 2-hour training, just like the other committee members.

Hotep Consulting: Information shared recently via email with the "core team" that explains the process. Faculty encouraged to participate in focus groups and surveys to ensure that faculty presence and views are represented.

Chancellor's message (Alisa Shubb shared): the Board of Trustees held a special extra meeting after last night's official Board meeting. The Chancellor's search was discussed, with a tentative timeline. Goal: new Chancellor by March, 2026. Want to avoid an interim. Suggestions were sought and shared about desired qualifications for candidates. PFP for consulting groups to help with the recruitment process. Question from Ricardo: does the Chancellor's cabinet stick around? Alisa: all cabinet members serve at the pleasure of the Chancellor. Faculty feedback can happen at the "impressions" level. Concerns with District HR discussed as something for future Chancellor to address.

Open Senate positions: Open Senate positions sheet distributed. Areas get to select how Senators are appointed to represent the Area.

11. Proposed revision international education: ask for comments or discussion on this regulation.

David: 2.33.4 question: Is "value judgements" what we're going for in that section?

Further discussion of this language requested.

A lot of language comes from Title V of the education code. But this comment will be taken back to DAS.

Mayra: in 2.3.8, are we adding in there? It currently fails to mention non-CalGETC GE patterns. Please recommend “previous GE patterns with catalog rights.” Urge to be all-encompassing of all GE patterns being eligible for inclusion.

Section 4.0 “transfer/graduation requirements” seems to address this.

It is, but it isn’t clear on 2.3.8.

12. Critical Hire Public Safety (1st read): Presented by Bill Wann adjunct assistant professor):

Description of the position/workload provided with PowerPoint presentation:

Supersede 50 classes, multiple instructors over the course of a week

Breadth of course offering (and the statewide demand for them) outlined

Recertification of specific courses and course progressions (POST and STC) happens often, with evolving and increasing guidelines. Time-intensive process. POST certification expires June 30.

Two coordinator positions sought in this critical hire: both replacements

All adjuncts have been used as LTTs.

Enrollment is down and certifications are at risk of being lost. If certifications are lost, our reputation is harmed and other community colleges will fill that void.

Alisa: if it is the inclination of the Senate to support the critical hires, she would like to see a recommendation moving forward to recommend to the Board that ARC be the only Los Rios campus offering these programs.

13. Resolution in support of Two-Spirit, Transgender, and Nonbinary Students and Employees (1st read) (David M.)

Presented the resolution as a chance to “do ally shit” (with story of that term provided).

Two-Spirit, Non-binary, and Trans students have had input on the resolution.

Baily (student): spends extensive time on campus, due to course schedule. The absence of a clear institutional statement of support and a denunciation of hate speech/rhetoric has caused anxiety and fear. The lack of visible and accessible restrooms has created hardship, as well.

Sara (faculty): request for funding to offer additional sections of queer- and trans-focused courses (INtro to LGBTQ+ Studies, for example). The importance of these topics emphasized within the current political climate. It was pointed out that we are technically out of compliance with the mandate to have a “queer affirming” mental health counselor accessible to ARC students. More resources for queer and trans students called for. PE and Kinesiology courses are not currently accessible and supportive of trans students at ARC.

Chris (Business): “moving away from the phrase ‘preferred name’” is included. A suggestion was sought to replace or accomplish the spirit of that phrase.

“Lived name” suggested or just “name”

Suggestion that “preferred pronoun” also be removed (and potentially added to the Resolution)

14. LRCCD. Class. Size Task Force Recommendations (1st read)

Alisa: Discussed the history of class size work in the Senate (passed a resolution locally, which was adopted by the District, to form a Class Size Task Force). Clear recommendations (4 recommendations) that unfortunately don’t directly solve the problem: we do not have a systematic way to address class sizes in Los Rios (key finding of the task force). Campus-to-campus variation on class sizes, which lead to equity issues.

Objective and transparent criteria encouraged for determining class sizes.

Difference between class sizes and “class caps” discussed. Size/range is theoretical (this would be an ideal size of a class). Caps are limits to a specific classes, based on course-specific, context-driven criteria.

Santa Barbara City College’s model was looked at as an ideal model.

The report is available for faculty to review. If approved, we could support the adoption of this system to determine optimal class size.

Daniel: what is the criteria for defining/operationalizing “optimal” in this process?

Alisa: Equity is central, with consideration given to SLOs and creating a context where the SLOs can best be achieved.

Tak: Is the taxonomy based on the course description or the

Alisa: The course description is primary, as well as modality and

pedagogy

Vivian: Work Experience is not included in this taxonomy. There is a specific formula at Los Rios for determining class size for that department

Alisa: this is meant as a template to be handed off to a "phase 2" team to be able to look through our course offerings and apply the taxonomy

Glenn: is this a district-level decision we're seeking to influence?

Alisa: yes.
